We listed products based on:

Discussions with Island retailers and an inventory of products they expected to have available in Spring 2007;

Discussions with Dr. Philip Dickey, staff scientist at Washington Toxics Coalition (WTC) and Dr. Jack Barbash, environmental chemist with expertise on groundwater contamination issues;

Information in the WTC publication "grow smart, grow safe" in which Dr. Dickey reviewed environmental impacts of active ingredients in lawn and garden products;

A review of the Institute of Environmental Research and Education's (IERE) compilation of the Washington State Department of Agriculture listing of heavy metals in fertilizer available on Vashon-Maury Island.

Before using herbicides or weed & feed products:

Consider using weeding tools like cultivators, flame weeders, hoes, pullers, and hand weeders;

If after trying other options you decide to use an herbicide, try using it on spots, rather than the whole lawn or landscape; Read the instructions for all products and use them with care. Apply in the correct season and in the right quantities to help protect our water and wildlife.
